## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Urging United States Department of Health and Human Services to Consult with Arizona Tribes on Federally Facilitated Exchanges)

RESOLUTION NO. 13-090

	WHEREAS,	the constitution of the rougho o dumin Nation vests the registrative council with the
2		authority ``top romote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals, education and provide for public health, peace and provide for public health, peace and
3		and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members" and "to
4		consult, negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts on behalf of the Tohono
5		O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local governments" (Constitution, Article
6		VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(f)); and
7	WHEREAS,	the Affordable Care Act, enacted on March 23, 2010, is a major piece of federal
8		legislation directed at comprehensive health insurance reforms with several
9		provisions affecting the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members, including the
10		expansion of Medicaid eligibility, beginning January 1, 2014, to all individuals under
11		133% of the federal poverty level, and the establish ment of competitive market places
12		for individuals and small employers to directly compare available private health
13		insurance options (Public Law 111-148, 124 Stat. 119); and
14	WHEREAS,	under the AffordableCareAct, stateshavetheoptiontoestablishaffordablein surance
15		exchanges to help individuals and small employers purchase affordable health
16		insurance, however, if a state declines to establish a state-based exchange, then the
17		Affordable Care Act directs the Secretary of Health and Human Services to establish
18		and operate a federally facilitated exchange in that state; and
19	WHEREAS,	on November~28, 2012, Arizona~Governor~Janice~K.~Brewer~declared~that~Arizona~would
20		not establish a state-based exchange and acknowledged that Arizona would instead
21		participate in a federally facilitated exchange; and
22	WHEREAS,	the Affordable Care Act contains numerous provisions specifically and directly
23		affectingNativeAmericansthatwillbeimplementedthroughthefederallyfacilitated
24		exchanges, including but not limited to an exemption to the tax penalty for non-
25		insurance coverage, an exemption for cost-sharing for individuals under 300% of the
26		federal poverty level, and special enrollment periods to enroll in the insurance
27		products offered on the exchanges; and

1	WHEREAS, enrollment in private health insurance options available on the federally facilitated
2	exchanges starts October 31, 2013 with coverage to begin January 1, 2014; and
3	WHEREAS, Native American tribes and their members in Arizona will be significantly affected by
4	the implementation of federally facilitated exchanges; and
5	WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Health and Human Services Committee recommends
6	urging the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to initiate consultation with
7	Arizona tribes concerning the federally facilitated exchanges.
8	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it urges the
9	U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to consult with Arizona tribes
10	${f concerning}$ the implementation of federally facilitated exchanges in accordance with
11	the Department's Tribal Consultation Policy.
12	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it authorizes the
13	Nation's chairperson or official designee to coordinate and collaborate with the Inter
14	Tribal Council of Arizona to request and advocate for consultation in accordance with
15 16	this resolution.
17 18	The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 13 <sup>TH</sup> Day
19	of <u>MARCH, 2013</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,780.60</u> FOR; <u>-0-</u> AGAINST; <u>-0-</u> NOT VOTING; and <u>[01]</u> ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article
20 21	VI, Section 1 <u>(c)(2) and 1(f)</u> of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant
22	Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
23	18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
