LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Setting April 12, 2013 Special Session for Review of Sequestration Impacts and Treasurer's Report on Nation's Finances)

LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 13-127

1	WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is vested with the power "to manage any
2	funds within the exclusive control of the Tohono O'odham Nation, including proceeds
3	derived from lands and resources of the Tohono O'odham Nation, and to appropriate
4	these funds for the benefit of the nation and its members." (Constitution, Article VI,
5	Section 1(d)(2)); and
6	WHEREAS, "All expenditures of these funds shall be pursuant to appropriations or budgets
7	authorized under resolutions or in accordance with ordinances of the Tohono
8	O'odham Council" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(d)(2)); and
9	WHEREAS, the Legislative Council is likewise empowered "to adopt, approve and amend annual
10	budgets and to authorize the expenditure of funds in accordance with these budgets"
11	(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(d)(3)); and
12	WHEREAS, the Legislative Council has enacted extensive financial legislation governing budgets,
13	revenue distribution, taxation, banking, fiscal signature authority, grants,
14	procurement, contracting, and other financial matters; and
15	WHEREAS,as the Tohono O'odham Judicial Court has declared,
16	The power of the Legislative Council is to enact laws. In order to legislate properly
17	and supervise the functions of the Executive and administrative agencies, it must
18	be thoroughly informed. In short, it must have the power to investigate. The scope
19	of its power can be as penetrating and far reaching as the power to make laws, and,
20	is proper under the Constitution.
21	<i>Francisco v. Toro</i> , 1 TOR 2d 68, 75 (appeal dism'd, <i>Francisco v. Toro</i> , 3 TOR 2d 15 (Sep.
22	4, 2008)); and
23	WHEREAS, the Legislative Council cannot effectively perform its constitutional obligation to
24	budget, appropriate, manage or invest the Nation's funds, or to exercise its additional
25	fiscal powers, without being thoroughly informed by receiving complete, accurate,
26	and timely information on all the Nation's finances; and
27	WHEREAS, the Legislative Council Budget and Finance Committee has requested an analysis of
28	impacts to the Nation from federal sequestration spending reductions and the Council
29	has requested regular reports on the Nation's finances.
30	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it sets a
31	special session on April 12, 2013 for an analysis of impacts to the Nation from federal

1	sequestration spending reductions and for a detailed report from the Nation's
2	treasurer on the Nation's finances.
3	BE IT FINALLY ORDERED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council directs the Nation's
4	treasurer
5	(1) to prepare and provide the Legislative Council with a detailed, written account of
6	all the Nation's finances, including but not limited to all current and projected
7	revenues, accounts and account balances, investments, budgets, budget surpluses,
8	and obligations, and to present this and any other information requested by the
9	Budget and Finance Committee in closed session during the April 12, 2013 special
10	session, and
11	(2) to provide the same information in writing, or any other format requested, and in
12	person to the Budget and Finance Committee and Legislative Council on a
13	quarterly basis and upon request from the Budget and Finance Committee.
