RESOLUTION NO. 13-169

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with the
2		authority "to promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals, education
3		and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members" and with the
4		authority to "consult with the Congress of the United States and appropriate federal
5		agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation
6		."(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(j)); and
7	WHEREAS,	in 2009, Congress mandated that the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and
8		Urban Development ("HUD") undertake a Native American housing needs assessment
9		$entitled {\it ``Assessment of Native American'}, A lask a {\it Native, and Native Hawaiian Housing}$
10		Needs" in order to collect better data to quantify the substantial needs of Indian
11		Country (Senate Report 111-69); and
12	WHEREAS,	HUD's Office of Policy Development and Research formulated the housing
13		assessment's surveys, data collection methodology, and scheduled a series of tribal
14		consultations which began March 5, 2012 and ended July 9, 2012, with a July 19, 2012
15		deadline for submission of comments; and
16	WHEREAS,	on July 12, 2012, the Legislative Council approved submission of the Nation's "July 2012 approved submission approved submission sub
17		Tohono O'odham Nation Comments" to HUD (Resolution No. 12-294); and
18	WHEREAS,	in a March 28, 2013 letter, the Urban Institute, the nonprofit organization contracted
19		$by HUD \ to \ implement \ the \ survey, requests \ the \ Nation's \ participation \ in \ the \ household$
20		survey portion of the housing needs assessment; and
21	WHEREAS,	the Housing Committee recognizes the importance of including the Nation, one of only and continuous continuou
22		forty tribes selected for the housing needs survey, and providing information
23		regarding housing needs and socioeconomic conditions of the Nation's members as
24		an addition to the information provided overall from Indian Country; and
25	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Ki:ki Association's Executive Director Pete Delgado agrees to be
26		the Nation's contact with HUD.
27	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it authorizes
28		HUD to conduct its assessment of Native American, Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian
