RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Approving a Lease and Memorandum of Understanding with the United States Customs and Border Protection for the San Miguel Law Enforcement Center Expansion and approving continued use of the Joint Use Facility for the US Border Patrol and the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department)

RESOLUTION NO. 13-203

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with the
2		authority to "administer land and other public property, and by law, ordinance or
3		resolution to manage, protect, preserve and regulate the use of the property,
4		wildlife, land, air and natural resources (including surface and ground waters) of the
5		Tohono O'odham Nation" and the power to consult "appropriate federal agencies
6		regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation" (Constitution,
7		Article VI, Section 1(i)(2) and 1 (j)); and
8	WHEREAS,	the southern border of the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation") includes 75 miles of the 100 miles 100
9		United States and Mexico international boundary ("International Boundary") and as
10		a result the Nation's members experience the direct negative impacts from illegal
11		$immigration\ and\ drug\ trafficking\ across\ the\ international\ border, including\ damage$
12		to the Nation's cultural resources, increased demands on tribal law enforcement,
13		violence and crime, illegal dumping, and environmental degradation; and
14	WHEREAS,	the Tucson Sector of the Unites States Border Patrol ("USBP"), as part of Customs and Customs
15		${\bf BorderProtectionoftheDepartmentofHomelandSecurity("CBP"), isresponsiblefor}$
16		securing the border along the International Boundary, including the areas within and
17		around the Nation; and
18	WHEREAS,	the USBP has proposed expanding the current San Miguel Law Enforcement Center
19		(LEC) from the current two (2) acres to approximately five (5) acres, which land
20		designation has been incorporated in a new lease and new Memorandum of
21		Understanding (MOU); and
22	WHEREAS,	the USBP has acknowledged that any waivers issued by the Secretary of the
23		Department of Homeland Security pursuant to section 102 (c) of the Illegal
24		Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996, as amended, do not
25		apply to the construction and operation of such a facility, and that the facility would
26		remainsubjecttofederalandNation'senvironmental, culturalresources, realty, and
27		other laws; and

RESOLUTION NO. 13-203 (Approving a Lease and Memorandum of Understanding with the United States Customs and Border Protection for the San Miguel Law Enforcement Center Expansion and approving continued use of the Joint Use Facility for the US Border Patrol and the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department) Page 2 of 4 WHEREAS, the new facility will be a joint use facility that will serve as a police substation for the 1 2 Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department; and 3 WHEREAS, the USBP plants to construct and place the items listed in the newly proposed lease 4 including a new modular building, new administration building, new Command and 5 Control Center, communication/camera tower for the Integrated Fixed Tower 6 Program, above ground fuel islands for Regular, Diesel, and JP5 aviation fuel, horse 7 corrals, new Processing Center with sally port, and expanded leach field, an expanded 8 helicopter pad, an ATV shed and storage, compound security fencing, gate card 9 reader, security lighting, RV plug banks, and back up generator at the site; and 10 WHEREAS, the original acreage has an environmental assessment that was completed and the 11 additional acreage will have an amended environmental assessment conducted prior 12 to any construction in coordination with the Tohono O'odham Nation and with the 13 Bureau of Indian Affairs as a cooperating agency; and 14 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has agreed to waive its right to an appraisal of the land 15 and the Tohono O'odham Nation has agreed to a rental payment of Three Thousand 16 Dollars (\$3,000.00) per year which exceeds the fair market value appraisal in 17 comparison with the land appraised in Pisinemo District; and WHEREAS, this Resolution and the attached documents have been reviewed by the Domestic 18 19 Affairs, the Agricultural and Natural Resources, and the Cultural Preservation 20 Committees, which recommend approval by the Legislative Council. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation Legislative Council approves 21 22 the Lease and MOU substantially in the form attached here for the expanded San 23 Miguel Law Enforcement Center, and authorizes the Chairman of the Nation to execute 24 both documents. BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Treasurer of the Nation shall divide revenues from the lease. 25 26 50% to Chukut Kuk District and 50% to the Nation. The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the ${\color{blue}04^{ ext{TH}}}$ Day 27 28 of <u>IUNE, 2013</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,780.60</u> FOR; <u>-0-</u>AGAINST; 29 [02] NOT VOTING; and [02] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham 30 Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs 31 (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). 32 33
