## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Approving a Lease and Memorandum of Understanding with the United States Customs and Border Protection for the Pisinemo District/Kupk/Dirtburn Temporary Camp and approving Joint Use of the Premises for the US Border Patrol and the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department)

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with the

2		authority to "administer land and other public property, and by law, ordinance or
3		resolution to manage, protect, preserve and regulate the use of the property,
4		wildlife, land, air and natural resources (including surface and ground waters) of the
5	<b> </b>	Tohono O'odham Nation" and the power to consult "appropriate federal agencies
6		regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation" (Constitution,
7		Article VI, Section 1(i)(2) and 1(j)); and
8	WHEREAS,	the southernborderof theTohonoO'od hamNation("Nation")includes75milesof the
9		United States and Mexico international boundary ("International Boundary") and as
10		a result the Nation's members experience the direct negative impacts from illegal
11		immigration  and  drug  trafficking  across  the  international  border, including  damage
12		to the Nation's cultural resources, increased demands on tribal law enforcement,
13		violence and crime, illegal dumping, and environmental degradation; and
14	WHEREAS,	the Tucson Sector of the United States Border Patrol ("USBP"), as part of Customs and
15		Border Protection of the Department of Homeland Security ("CBP"), is responsible for the the the the the the the the
16		securing the border along the International Boundary, including the areas within and
17		around the Nation; and
18	WHEREAS,	the USBP has proposed a temporary camp at the Pisinemo District/Kupk/Dirtburn
19		Temporary Camp Site that consists of approximately three (3) acres, which land
20		designation has been incorporated in a lease and a Memorandum of Understanding
21		(MOU); and
22	WHEREAS,	the USBP has acknowledged that any waivers issued by the Secretary of the
23		Department of Homeland Security pursuant to section 102(c) of the Illegal
24		Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996, as amended, do not
25		apply to the construction and operation of the Temporary Camp Site, and that it would
26		remain subject to federal and Nation's environmental, cultural resources, realty, and
27		other laws; and
28	WHEREAS,	the Pisinemo District/Kupk/Dirtburn Temporary Camp Site premises will be available
29		for use by the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department; and

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1	WHEREAS, the USBP plans to install perimeter fencing on the premises, and deploy mobile
2	trailers and other temporary structures, including temporary horse stalls, as
3	necessary to support the operations of the temporary camp; and
4	WHEREAS, the environmental assessment, site survey, and Geo-Technical studies have been
5	completed for the three (3) acres located at the Pisinemo District/Kupk/Dirtburn
6	Temporary Camp Site along with the 8.8 miles of roadway from Federal Route 21 or
7	Federal Route 24 to the Temporary Camp Site turn off that also includes .8 miles fron
8	Federal Route 24 to the Pisinemo District/Kupk/Dirtburn Temporary Camp Site; and
9	WHEREAS, this Resolution and the attached documents have been reviewed by the Domestic
10	Affairs, the Agricultural and Natural Resources, and the Cultural Preservation
11	Committees, which recommend approval by the Legislative Council.
12	${f NOW}, {f THEREFORE}, {f BEIT}$ RESOLVED that the ${f Tohono}$ O'odham Nation Legislative Council approves
13	the Lease and MOU substantially in the form attached hereto for the Pisinemo
14	District/Kupk/Dirtburn Temporary Camp Site, and authorizes the Chairman of the
15	Nation to execute both documents.
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the USBP Patrol Agent in Charge of the Casa Grande Station will
17	provide a quarterly status update to the District Chairperson of the Pisinemo District
18	and the communities of Kupk and Dirtburn of its intent to utilize the Temporary Camp
19	Site.
20	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Treasurer of the Nation shall divide the revenues from the Lease
21	50% to Pisinemo District and 50% to the Nation.
22 23 24 25 26 27 28	The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the <u>04<sup>TH</sup> Day</u> of <u>IUNE, 2013</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,780.60</u> FOR; <u>-0-AGAINST; [01]</u> NOT VOTING; and <u>[02]</u> ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
