# RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Amending Resolution No. 14-240, "Suspending Section 1105 of 27 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 1 and Establishing Moratorium on Hia-Ced Regional Reference Changes and Designations")

## **RESOLUTION NO. 14-554**

1	WHEREAS,	"It shall be the policy of the Tohono O'odham Nation to seek the return to the
2		Tohono O'odham Nation of lands and natural resources, including minerals and
3		water rights, within or adjacent to the Tohono O'odham Nation, or which
4		originally were a part of the historic Papagueria." (Constitution of the Tohono
5		O'odham Nation, Article XVI, Section 9); and
6	WHEREAS,	the Hia-Ced O'odham since time immemorial inhabited lands in western
7		Papagueria between the western boundaries of the Tohono O'odham (formerly
8		"Papago") villages and the Colorado River and extending south of the current
9		international border between the United States and Mexico (Resolution No. 16-
10		84); and
11	WHEREAS,	Hia-Ced O'odham homelands were inadvertently omitted when the Sells
12	-	Reservation was established in 1917, and while the Papago Council and Tohono
13		O'odham Council adopted resolutions calling upon the United States Congress
14		to reserve former Hia-Ced O'odham lands within Pima County, Arizona as
15	a -	reservation land, the necessary federal legislation was not enacted (Resolution
16		No. 30-81, Resolution No. 16-84, Resolution No. 77-89); and
17	WHEREAS,	the Hia-Ced O'odham individually and through the Hia-Ced O'odham Alliance,
18		the Hiatit O'odham Policy Board, Hia-Ced O'odham Program, Hia-Ced O'odham
19		Advisory Committee, and other organizations continued to advocate for the
20		enumeration of Hia-Ced O'odham descendants or persons with Hia-Ced
21		O'odham lineage, the ability to enroll as members of the Tohono O'odham
22		Nation, to recover traditional homelands in and near Darby Wells, Mohik Vaya
23		(Soft Well), and other locations as a Hia-Ced O'odham land base, and ultimately
24		to establish a 12th district of the Nation for the Hia-Ced O'odham; and
25	WHEREAS,	Article IX of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation recognizes the
26		existence of district governments with authority over matters of local concern;
27		provided that the Legislative Council may change district boundaries, create
28		additional districts, or reduce the number of districts; and

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1WHEREAS,the districts "are organizations of fairly limited power and authority which may2act only under the supervision of the Tohono O'odham Council" and which may3not expend district funds without a budget approved by district council4resolution and by the Legislative Council; Juan v. Juan, 2 TOR3d 62 (Trial Ct., Jan.527, 2000) appeal dismissed, 3 TOR3d 1 (Jan. 4, 2005); Constitution, Article IX,6Section 7); and

7 WHEREAS. district governments may not assume the Nation's authority to enforce national 8 laws, San Xavier District Council: Austin Nunez v. Jose Francisco, 1 TOR3d 49 9 (Trial Ct., Feb.1, 1988), waive sovereign immunity without the Nation's 10 authorization, Juan v. Juan, 2 TOR3d 62 (Trial Ct., Jan. 27, 2000) appeal 11 dismissed, 3 TOR3d 1 (Jan. 4, 2005), refuse to recognize the election of district 12 officials who have been certified by the Nation's Election Board, Verlon Jose v. 13 Harriet Toro, et. al., 3 TOR3d 31 (Ct.App., Jul.27, 2011), Tohono O'odham Nation v. 14 Gu-Vo Governing Council, 3 TOR3d 34 (Ct.App., Aug. 24, 2011), or exercise general 15 management authority over unallotted, national lands within district 16 boundaries, Throssell v. Throssell, 1 TOR3d 34 (Ct.App., Feb.6, 1992); and

17WHEREAS,effective October 30, 2012 the Legislative Council by Resolution No. 12-423 and18pursuant to the Creation of the Hia-Ced District of the Tohono O'odham Nation19ordinance ("Hia-Ced Creation Ordinance"), 27 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 1,20created the Hia-Ced District and established the District's boundaries; and

21WHEREAS,each member of the Nation is assigned an enrollment number that includes a22"regional reference" identifying the member's resident district or "no district" if23no resident district has been identified, and the regional references "are to be24used for enrollment numbering purposes only, and no residence [or] other25conclusions shall result from the use thereof." (Papago Enrollment Manual,26Processing Applications-Membership Records, 3. Filing of Applications); and

WHEREAS, although the Papago Enrollment Manual prohibits changes in enrollment
 regional references once they are assigned to an application, Section 1105(A) of
 the Hia-Ced Creation Ordinance originally created an exception allowing that
 "an enrolled member of the Tohono O'odham Nation who has already been

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1		assigned an enrollment number may change that member's regional
2		reference, or the regional reference of an enrolled minor on behalf of whom the
3		member has the legal authority to act, to the new Hia-Ced District using the
4		initials "HC."; and
5	WHEREAS,	in response to concerns over the stability, organization, and governance of the
6		Hia-Ced District, the application of the Hia-Ced O'odham enumeration to the
7		new District and to the Creation Ordinance, and other issues, the Legislative
8		Council by Resolution No. 14-240 suspended Section 1105 of the Hia-Ced
9		Creation Ordinance, creating a general moratorium on regional reference
10		transfers after June 11, 2014; and
11	WHEREAS,	Resolution No. 14-240 continues to permit approval of regional reference
12		transfers and of applications for adoption and for membership with an HC
13		regional reference that were filed prior to the resolution's June 11, 2014
14		effective date; and
15	WHEREAS,	it is in the Nation's best interest to clarify that applications for adoption and for
16		membership that have been assigned an HC regional reference may continue to
17		be processed pending the outcome of the legislative evaluations and policy
18		discussions provided by Resolution No. 14-240 and 14-506.
19	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that
20		Resolution No. 14-240, "Suspending Section 1105 of 27 Tohono O'odham Code
21		Chapter 1 and Establishing Moratorium on Hia-Ced Regional Reference Changes
22		and Designations" is amended to add the following paragraph to the "BE IT
23		FURTHER RESOLVED" clause:
24		(4) Applications for adoption and for membership in the Tohono O'odham
25		Nation filed after June 11, 2014 and that are assigned an "HC" regional
26		reference may be amended at the applicant's request to reflect another
27		regional reference and shall then be processed and approved or rejected
28		in accordance with the Enrollment Ordinance; provided that such a
29		regional reference may be changed if expressly authorized by the
30		Nation's laws.
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The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the  $16^{TH}$ day of <u>DECEMBER, 2014</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2.926.9</u> FOR; 19.6 AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [01] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article V; Article VI, Section 1 and Section 1(1); Article VI, Section 1(h); Article X, Section 7; and Article XVI, Section 9 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
