WHEREAS, The Papago Council did by Resolution No. 439 authorize the Chairman to place an order for a police wagon with such dealer as may best meet the needs and requirements of the Papago Council, and


WHEREAS, Bogard GMC Company of Tucson, Arizona has ordered and received a one-ton Panel Truck for the Papago Tribe and has made the necessary changes and installations required for use as a police-wagon,

THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Papago Council that payment in the amount of \$2,636.80, which represents in full the payment for the truck and the necessary changes and installations ordered on the truck, be made from the General Fund PT-1.

The foregoing resolution was on January 6, 1950, duly enacted by a vote of 15 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.


