

RESOLUTION  
OF  
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

NO. 447

WHEREAS, On April 19, 1935, the Executive Committee of the Papago Council by resolution consented and agreed to a withdrawal and reserving for Agency purposes certain lands containing 500 acres, and

WHEREAS, No attempt has ever been made to keep the Agency Reserve free from settlements on it by members of the Papago Tribe so that at the present time most of the Papago homes in Sells are located on the Agency Reserve, and

WHEREAS, The lands are such that most of it could never be used by the Agency and it would be highly improper to move those Papagos who are now well established,

THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Papago Council that Richard Hendricks and Jose Iancho, representing the Business Committee of the Council, Louis Harvey and Ramon Antone, representing the Papago Council, and George Norris and Patrick Stevens, representing the Sells District Council, be appointed to the Tribal Land Reserves Committee, and

Be It Further Resolved, That, in line with the planning embodied in the Papago Development Program on construction, the Committee be authorized to study out sites for school buildings, a hospital, quarters, etc., and recommend to the Papago Council that those sites be set aside as Tribal Reserves,

PROVIDED, That the Superintendent and members of the Agency Staff be invited to participate in the work of the Committee on behalf of the Agency,

Be It Further Provided, That the members of the Tribal Land Reserves Committee be paid in accordance with the provisions of Resolution No. 394 of the Papago Council.

The foregoing resolution was on February 3, 1950, duly enacted by a vote of 21 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 2 (e) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
