

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 557

WHEREAS, Emergencies have arisen which have necessitated immediate action by the Papago Tribal Court and have also disqualified the Judge and Associate Judges, and

WHEREAS, Section 3 (b) Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe gives the Papago Council power to provide for the maintenance of Law and Order and the administration of justice by establishing a Tribal Court or courts and a police force, and defining the powers and duties of such courts and police,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL, That the Chairman of the Papago Council be authorized to appoint special Judges of the Tribal Court in cases of emergency when the Judge and Associate Judges have been disqualified, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Per Diem at the rate of ten-dollars (\$10.00) shall be allowed the Special Judges for service in the Tribal Court,

PROVIDED, That the Per Diem shall be payable from Fund FT-8, Papago Tribe, Court Fund.

The foregoing resolution was on May 4, 1951, duly enacted by a vote of 16 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 3 (b), of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1935, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
