

RESOLUTION  
OF  
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 605

WHEREAS, W. S. Haythorne and Son of Tucson, Arizona who has been manufacturing moccasins in Flagstaff and Tucson, has applied to the Papago Council for permission to move its operation to Sells, Arizona where this company feels it can obtain the proper amount and kind of help, and

WHEREAS, It is the plan of Haythorne and Son to train Papagos in the making of their particular kind of moccasin and to build up a force of trained Papago workers sufficient to allow expansion of the company's operation,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL, That in accordance with Section 5 A of Ordinance No. 14 of the Papago Council, a Tribal Business License is hereby approved for W. S. Haythorne and Son,

PROVIDED, That in accordance with Section 5 of Ordinance No. 14 the minimum fee shall be charged with an adjustment made at the beginning of the following year based upon the actual business done during the opening period, and

PROVIDED FURTHER, That the Tribal Business License herein granted W. S. Haythorne and Son shall expire June 30, 1952 prior to which date W. S. Haythorne and Son shall apply for renewal of their Business License, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That permission is hereby granted W. S. Haythorne and Son to the use of space in one of the Arts & Crafts rooms of the Papago Council for its operations,

PROVIDED, That a rental fee shall be established for this facility, and

PROVIDED FURTHER, That W. S. Haythorne and Son shall pay all expenses incidental to the use of this facility.

The foregoing resolution was on March 7, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 15 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 3 (e) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
