RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, An invitation has been extended to the Papago Agency and Tribal police to attend an FBI school which is to be held in Ajo, Arizona from April 8th to 11th, 1952, and

WHEREAS, It is the feeling of the Councilthat training to be gotten in such a school will be beneficial to the Agency and Tribal police and the Papago people, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Agency has authorized the attendance by Oliver K. Horisto, Chlef of Police and Adolph Averisto, Policeman, at the FBI school.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL, That Robert A. Pablo, Willie Wilson, Lewis Thomas and Norbert Leonard are hereby authorized to attend the special FBI school to be held in Ajo on April 8th to 11th, 1952.

PROVIDED, That Per Diem, Lodging and mileage be authorized in accordance with Resolution No. 394 of the Papago Council, and

PROVIDED FURTHER, That said Per Diem, Lodging and mileage be paid in advance from PT-1, Papago Tribe, General Fund,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Ramon Antone be appointed temporary Caretaker-Jailer and special policeman to serve during the absence of Caretaker-Jailer and Policemen, in accordance with Resolution No. 554.

The foregoing resolution was on April 4, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 15 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 3 (a) and (b) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
