

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res No. 614

WHEREAS: The Papago Council; in setting up uniform rates for the officers and members of the Papago Council, its Boards and Committees; authorizing overtime pay for the Tribal Caretaker and Jailer and; authorizing the hiring of temporary drivers, laborers and other types of workers, skilled and unskilled, in the course of the work of the Papago Council; did not anticipate the necessity for over-time payment to the Clerk of the Papago Tribal Court, and.

WHEREAS: The increased activities of the Law & Order Committee of the Papago Council and the revision of the Law and Order Code of the Papago Tribe make it necessary for the Clerk of the Papago Tribal Court to attend numerous night sessions of the Law and Order Committee;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL: That the Clerk of the Papago Tribal Court shall be paid the same rate as are paid the members of the Law and Order Committee for attendance at authorized meetings, in accordance with Resolution No. 394.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 16 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 2 (e), 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
