RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res.	No.	624

WHEREAS, In accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 20 of the Papago Council, the Papago Loan Board has control of all expenditures from the Papago Loan Fund, except as otherwise provided, and of the Expense Fund, and is responsible to the Papago Council for its actions and for the saluty of the Loan Fund, and

WHEREAS, Due to the delinquent status of many of the loans to the members of the Papago Tribe, the Papago Loan Board has recommended to the Papago Council that the loaning phase of the loan program be temporarily terminated pending a revision of the Loan Board's procedure in collecting delinquent loans,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL, That all loaning of funds from the Papago Loan Fund shall cease as of the date of this resolution, until such a time, as in the discretion of the Loan Board and the Papago Council, it is feasible to resume the making of loans from the Papago Loan Fund, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Manager of the Papago Loan Board is hereby authorized to collect each month on each delinquent loan not more than \$10.00 for crediting to the Interest and principal of the delinquent loans, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the employers of those members of the Papago Tribe whose loans are in delinquent status, the State and Tribal Livestock Inspector and, all licensed Livestock buyers on the Papago reservations, shall be requested and are hereby authorized to withold and turn over to the Manager of the Papago Loan Board not more than \$10.00 from the salary, wages or income from the sale of all livestock, of those persons whose loans are in delinquent status.

The foregoing resolution was on June 27, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 13 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 2 (e), (f), 3(a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
