

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 629

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 583 of the Papago Council appointed Juan Jose as Tribal Judge and authorized payment of a joint salary of \$125.00 per month, payable jointly from gratuitous Indian Service Law and Order funds in the amount not to exceed \$600.00 per annum and from Account FT-3, Papago Tribe, Court Fund, and

WHEREAS, The volume of work in the Papago Tribal Court justifies a full time judge and a raise in salary and further, that conflicts and misunderstandings have arisen because of the 26 pay period per annum method of payment of the Indian Service and the regular 24 pay period method of the Papago Tribe.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That effective July 1, 1952 the salary of the Tribal Judge be raised to an average of \$150.00 per month or \$1800.00 per annum and that the Superintendent of the Papago Agency be requested to pay from the Indian Service Law and Order fund, on a 26 pay period basis, a sum not to exceed \$900.00 per annum in accordance with Indian Office authorization, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the balance of the \$1200.00 per annum salary be paid on a regular 24 pay period basis from Account FT-8A, Papago Tribal Court operation;

The foregoing resolution was on July 11, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 13 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 2 (a) and 3 (a), (b), of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934, (48 Stat. 964). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V of the Constitution and by-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
