

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 632

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL, That Account PT-10A, Papago Tribal Livestock Operation be established and the Superintendent of the Papago Agency be instructed to transfer \$6,770.00 from Account PT-10, Papago Tribe, Tax Collection from Livestock Sales, to Account PT-10A, Papago Tribal Livestock Operation, as the Papago Tribal Livestock Operation budget for the Fiscal Year 1953.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary and Treasurer of the Papago Council be authorized to sign vouchers from Fund PT-10A for the amounts and purposes called for in the following budget.

For

1. Papago Livestock Inspector Salary, Per Diem, Promotion and Lump Sum Payment	\$1,500.00
2. Livestock Clerk's Salary, Per Diem and Lump Sum Payment	1,950.00
3. Office Supplies, Stationary, Postage, Telephone and Telegraph tolls	400.00
4. Livestock Inspector's Truck Operations, Maintenance and Repairs	600.00
5. Travel expenses and pay allowances for Papago Brands Committee	500.00
6. Travel expenses and pay allowances for Papago Livestock Board Members	1,300.00
7. Bill of Sales - Inspection books, and Field Receipt Books	250.00
8. Livestock Inspector's Bond Premium and Truck Insurance Coverage	120.00
9. Miscellaneous Expenditures	150.00
TOTAL	\$6,770.00

PROVIDED, That the unobligated balance in Account PT-10, Papago Tribe, Tax Collection from Livestock Sales, as of June 30, 1952 less the amount of the above budget be transferred to Account PT-1, Papago Tribe, General Fund, and

PROVIDED FURTHER, That any unobligated balance in Account PT-10A, Papago Tribal Livestock Operation, at the end of Fiscal Year 1953 shall revert to Account PT-1, Papago Tribe, General Fund.

The foregoing resolution was on August 1, 1952, duly acted by a vote of 15 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a), Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 pursuant to Sec. 12 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
