Res. No. 641

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 619 of the Papago Council revised the operations of the Papago Tribal Court and established Account PT-8A, Papago Tribal Court Operations, as the Papago Tribal Court budget account, and,

WHEREAS, Item No. 3 of resolution No. 619 provides for the salary, social security taxes, lump sum payment, promotion and per diem for the Tribal Caretaker and Jailer,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL, That resolution No. 554 be revised to read as follows:

WHEREAS, in the absence of an adequate police force and appropriated funds for law and order, it has been necessary to assign the Tribal Caretaker and Jailer to police work almost continually and frequently necessary to hire special Tribal policemen to police celebration, fiestas, etc.,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL, That the Tribal Caretaker and Jailer be paid at a rate to be set by the Papago Council upon certification by the Tribal Secretary and Treasurer, from Account PT-8A, Papago Tribal Court Operations,

PROVIDED: That the Caretaker and Jailer shall be responsible to the Court Clerk for the proper care of the Tribal Jail and Court Room and for the feeding and safe-keeping of the prisoners; shall be deputized as a Tribal policeman and; shall under the direction of the Chief of Police assist when called upon in the enforcement of law and order.

PROVIDED FURTHER, That any time worked by the Caretaker and Jailer, beyond the usual 40 hour week be paid for from the Account PT-8A, Papago Tribal Court Operations at the rate of one-dollar and eight cents (\$1.08) an hour upon certification by the Chief of Police, the Chairman of the Papago Council, or other officers to the Secretary and Treasurer that such work was necessary and authorized.

PROVIDED FURTHER: That any time worked by the Caretaker and Jailer and any other persons hired for temporary service in the enforcement of law and order as Tribal policemen shall be paid for from Account PT-8A, Tribal Court Operations, at the rate of one-dollar (\$1.00) per hour upon certification by the Chief of Police or the Chairman of the Papago Council to the Secretary and Treasurer that such work was necessary and authorized.

RESOLUTION

The foregoing resolution was on August 1, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 15 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 3 (a), (b), Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
