

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, The operations of the Papago Tribe have grown tremendously so that large quantities of gasoline, oil and lubricants are being used annually by and for the operations of the Papago Tribal Government and the Districts of the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, The Chairman of the Papago Council was on July 11, 1952, authorized by the Papago Council to negotiate with the various firms in the State of Arizona for the purchase of the necessary service station equipment to supply the Papago Tribe with its own facilities for servicing its vehicles and other equipment, which facilities will effect a saving in the long run,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL, That the following pieces of equipment be purchased from the EATON METAL PRODUCTS COMPANY of Phoenix, Arizona:

AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the payment of the total sum of \$952.29 be and is hereby authorized to the EATON METAL PRODUCTS COMPANY, for the above mentioned equipment, to be made from Account PT-1, Papago Tribe, General Fund, and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, That payment for the cost of installation and other expenses incidental to the installation of the gas tank, gasoline pump, and air compressor set, shall be made from Account PT-1, Papago Tribe, General Fund.

The foregoing resolution was on August 1, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 15 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V

of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.

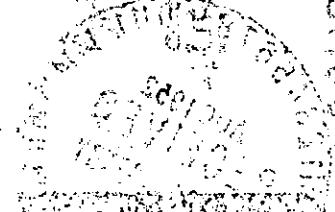
