

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 617

WHEREAS, The Papago Council at its special meeting of April 18, 1952 decided that considerable work must be done to the Tribal grandstand and bleachers in order to avoid any casualties due to collapsing of the seating facilities at the coming shows of the Papago Tribe, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribal Office failed to prepare such a resolution, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council recognized that there are not available sufficient Tribal funds to completely repair all of the grandstand, box seat section and the bleachers before the coming 1952 Fall show of the Papago Tribe, but believes that as much work as possible should be done,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL, That the Superintendent of the Papago Agency is hereby instructed to transfer the sum of \$800.00 from Account PT-1, General Fund to Account PT-18, Papago Tribe, Fair and Lodge Grandstand Construction, to be expended for materials, labor and other expenses necessary for the repairs to the Tribal grandstand and bleachers,

PROVIDED, That any unobligated balance shall revert to Account PT-1, General Fund, and

PROVIDED FURTHER, That the repair work shall be done under the supervision of the Fair & Lodge Association.

The foregoing resolution was on September 12, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 27 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Sec. 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 964). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Secretary of the Interior, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Sec. 6 Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
