RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 652

WHEREAS: The dates for the annual Papago Indian Rodeo and Arts & Crafts exhibit are set for October 25 and 26, 1952 and

WHEREAS: There are in the Account of the Papago Fair and Rodeo Association immufficient funds to meet the guarantees required for Livestock contracts.

THEREFORE BE THE RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL: That the Superintendent of the Papago Agency be instructed to pay to the Papago Pair and Rodan Association the sum of \$500.00 from Account PT-1, General Fund,

PROVIDED: That the Account PT-1 shall be refunded by the Papago Pair and Roleo Association following the Annual Papago Indian Rodeo and 4rts & Crafts exhibit, and

PROVIDED FURTHER: That an Account be set up in the Tribal Office to take ware of the repayment of the above loan to the Papago Fair and Rodeo Association.

The foregoing Resolution was on September 26, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 16 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a), Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16, of the Act of June 18, 1934, (46 Stat. 904). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.

- (c) On Sundays breakfast shall be served at 10 A.M. and their supper at 4 P.M.
- (d) All prisoners who are confined in the Tribal Jail House and not permitted to work shall have only 2 meals a day, in accordance with the meal schedule for Sunday. All persons in solitary confinement shall be permitted 2 light meals a day and no food or any other thing shall be given them from the outside except by permission of the Jailer, policemen or one of the judges.
- (e) Immediately following their supper the prisoners shall be secured in the Jail House.

III VISITING HOURS:

- (a) The regular visiting hours shall be between the hours of 3:00 and 4:00 P.M. on Saturdays and Sundays and no loitering shall be permitted at any time around the Jail House and Jail Mess, Provided that visiting hours may be permitted during the meal hour in certain cases.
- (b) Persons not residing in the community of Sells who may wish to visit any of the prisoners before or after the regular hours may do so by obtaining permission from the Tribal Jailer, policemen or any one of the judges.

IV PRISONERS REGULATIONS:

- (a) Any person serving a sentence of 30 days or more shall be required to serve one half of his sentence before becoming eligible for a parole, <u>Provided</u>, that such person has complied with the regulations embodied herein and has been recommended for parole by the Tribal Jailer.
- (b) No prisoner shall be permitted to have in his possession either in the Jail House or in the Jail Mess a radio, musical instrument, or any other instrument at any time.
- (c) All persons confined in the Tribal Jail House shall not be permitted to converse with persons on the outside or whistle at persons passing by.
- (d) No prisoner shall be permitted to visit any of the stores or the Post Office at any time.
- (e) On Saturday afternoons all the prisoners shall be permitted to bathe or shower or wash their clothing from 12:00 noon to 4:00 P.M.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL, That all resolutions or portions there-of which are in conflict with this resolution are hereby rescinded.

The foregoing resolution was on September 26, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 16 for and 0 against by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1 (1), 3 (b) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (43 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
