

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 655

WHEREAS: The Papago Tribe has received a loan from the Revolving Credit Fund of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and desires to enter into the retail grocery business;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL: That the attached Plan of Operation of the Papago Tribal Store Enterprise, consisting of six pages, is hereby approved, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the said Papago Tribal Store Enterprise shall be operated in accordance with the attached Plan of Operation on The Papago Tribe's own authority and responsibility.

PROVIDED: That the Plan of Operation may be amended as experience with the plan necessitates it.

The foregoing resolution was on October 24, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 17 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Sec. 2 (f) Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 904). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
