

RESOLUTION  
OF  
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 659

WHEREAS: The culinary equipment and the plumbing fixtures in the Tribal jail mess and the jail are badly in need of replacement and it is the feeling of The Papago Council that in order to safeguard the welfare of the Tribal prisoners every attempt should be made to maintain the best hygiene practices;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL: That authorization is hereby given for the purchase of a cooking stove and all of the necessary fixtures; a hot water tank and all of the necessary plumbing and fixtures; a toilet bowl, a tank and all of the necessary plumbing and fixtures and; such utensils as may be necessary;

PROVIDED: That payment for the above purchases and any labor involved shall be made from Account PT-8, Papago Tribe, Court Fund.

The foregoing resolution was on November 7, 1952, duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and 0 against by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2 (h), 3 (a), (b) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 pursuant to Sec. 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Sec. 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
