

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 930

WHEREAS, The Papago Council wishes to arouse interest of individuals and companies to mineral prospects on the Papago Reservation, and set forth the fees and conditions for issuance of prospecting permits;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that prospecting permits be issued to enable individuals and mining companies to explore the mineral resources of the reservation. It directs its Chairman and authorizes the Superintendent of Papago Agency to advertise and issue such permits in Districts which approve this plan.

The permit shall be for one year from date of issue, and the fee shall be \$25.00. The permit shall cover the combined area of all Districts which approve the plan, and later may extend to other Districts approving the plan.

The permits shall be non-exclusive, and contain no rights to a lease.

The Superintendent shall request financial information from all applicants and may require \$1,000.00 bond if it is deemed the applicant does not have sufficient financial assets.

Each permit shall contain provisions to minimize all dangerous areas by erecting fences or other barriers around test holes and excavations; that permittee make remuneration for property damaged and livestock injured or death occasioned as a result of permittee's operations; that no exploration operations be conducted within 500 yards of any village or settlement nor within 100 yards of any cemetery, water well, spring or corral; that upon termination of the permit the permittee make provision for conservation and protection of property and leave all areas on which he has worked in a condition that will not be hazardous to life or limb.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1957, duly enacted by a vote of 22 for and 0 against at a regular meeting of the Papago Council at which a quorum was present, pursuant to the power delegated and granted to the Tribal Council by the Secretary of the Interior in a letter to the Area Director dated March 1, 1957, all of which is authorized by Section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
