WHEREAS, A careful check indicates that the applicants were born off the Papago Indian Reservation but within the continental United States, and

WHEREAS, The applicants have applied for and received permission to reside in the Poso Redondo village of the Hickiwan District;

THEREFORE HE IT RESOLVED, by the Papago Council that the following persons be adopted into the Papago Tribe and shall have all rights and privileges enjoyed by other members of the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on December 6, 1957, duly enacted by a vote of 21 for and 0 against by the Papago Council during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 1, (b) Article II of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 193h, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is offective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
