

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1031

WHEREAS, The Schuk Toak District Council, in a meeting held Sunday, March 1, 1959, considered a request of A.U.R.A. to remove decomposed granite from a 5 acre tract located at the foot of Kitt Peak as described on a map furnished by A.U.R.A., the gravel to be used in construction work on the observatory site, the permit to be for a period of 10 years with an option to renew, and

WHEREAS, A.U.R.A.'s application also included a request for a 40' x 40' fenced area for vehicle storage in the area, as well as permission to erect a 200' drift fence, and

WHEREAS, The Schuk Toak District unanimously authorized the permit provided that A.U.R.A. pay 7¢ per cubic yard for the material removed;

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the Chairman of the Papago Council and the Superintendent of the Papago Agency be authorized to issue and approve the necessary permit to A.U.R.A., provided they agree to pay a price of 7¢ per cubic yard for all material removed.

The foregoing resolution was on March 6, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 22 for and 0 against by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
