

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1038

WHEREAS, The Papago Agency gave the Sells District Council permission to dismantle and remove Agency Quarters #88 for its present site, to be set up elsewhere as a Council Building, and

WHEREAS, The Agency allowed the Sells District only 90 days from December 4 to do this work and it was impossible to take care of it on a voluntary basis, so Fernando Smith was hired at a rate of \$5.00 per day starting February 17, and he has worked 24 days so far, making a total owing him of \$120.00, and

WHEREAS, Although the members of the District expect to work on Saturdays on a voluntary basis to re-erect the building, nevertheless there will be other expense to complete removal, plus miscellaneous expenses in re-erecting the building, which are estimated at \$100.00,

WHEREAS, The Sells District unanimously passed a Resolution at its meeting on March 30, 1959, at which a quorum was present, requesting that it be authorized to spend up to \$500.00 of District funds during the balance of the fiscal year for the purpose of moving and setting up a Council building, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribal Council considers this emergency request for funds to be justified.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the Treasurer be authorized to disburse up to \$500.00 in Sells District funds for the above purpose, provided that any request for payments be accompanied by invoices or written requests, approved in writing by both the District Chairman and District Secretary.

The foregoing resolution was on April 3, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 21 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934, (48 Stat. 981). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
