RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, C. J. Higman has been employed as Administrative Assistant to the Chairmen of the Papago Council cince February, 1958, and

WHEREAS, The Council realizes It. Highen has provided the Tribe with valuable edvicery service in business matters, has made the operation of the Tribel Office much more efficient, has helped to improve public relations between the Tribe and groups off the Reservation, and has assisted the Tribe in many other ways, and

WHENEAS, The Tribe did not have to pay any of ir. Highan's solary or expenses for the first year of his employment, and is paying only \$2,000 for this purpose from February 1, 1959 to June 30, 1959, in accordance with Resolution No. 997, of June 6, 1958, and

WHEREAS, Although the Council, in Resolution No. 932 of April 5, 1957, and again in Resolution 997, expressed its intention of trying to assume the full expense of this position after one year's time, nevetheless Nr. Higgson states that if the Tribo will include 03500 towards his salary, and a provision for his expenses of \$500, for the 1960 fiscal year, that he willing to try to secure the balance needed from outside contributions, and

WHERES, If the Council wishes to respecint it. Higher for the 1960 fiscal year and includes the amount above mentioned in the budget, and he is able to get the balance needed from outside contributions, he will accept, if he has a contract hiring him for a full year and guaranteeing him the requested amount for salary and expenses. This is needed because if he is to stay snother year, Mr. Higher will have to nove his family from Scattle, Washington, which will be very expensive and he cannot afford to do so unless he is guaranteed one year's employment and the salary and expenses requested.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it reappoint C. J. Higmen, Administrative Assistant to the Chairmon of the Papago Council for the fiscal year 1960, that it include in the budget \$3500 towards his calary, and expenses of \$500, and that it authorize the Chairman to approve a contract guaranteeing him a full year's employment and the full payment of this portion of his salary and expenses.

The foregoing resolution was on April 3, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 21 for and 0 against by the Papage Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) & (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1931, (h) Stat. 98h). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papage Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laus of the Papage Tribe.
