NESCIUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

PRS. NO. 1013

WHENEAS, Johnny Plaine made application in his letter of April 1, 1959, for a five year lease on relinquished assignment 75A and B of the Fast Chuichm project, and

WHENER, Johnny Blaine wishes this lease without paying rental to the Tribe for the first two years because of the expense and work necessary to bring the land back into production, and

WHERMAS, The Tribal Commill is willing to make the lease on a rent free known for one year only, the same as other lease made on the relinquiched assignments in the project.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESCIVED by the Papago Tribal Council that a five year lesse be granted to Johnny Diaine on Tracto 75A and B on the following terms:

Perments to be made as follows: No rental asyment to be made to the Tribe during the first year—proceeds from crops during the first year to be used for operating costs on the lead it being understood that this includes all expenses such as water assessments and liens on equipment purchased from the Farm Home Administration by the provious assignee, and all other charges incident to the farming of the plot. After the first year, in addition to regular operating costs, the rental rate on the lami will be (5.00 per sere per year. After the fifth year this rate may be changed by the Tribal-Council if it votesste do so. If the requirements of the lease are not fulfilled, the lease may be cancelled by action of the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on April 3, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 21 for and 0 against by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 193h, (h) Stat. 98h). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
