

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1044

WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs proposes to complete the improvement and surfacing of U.S.I.S. Route No. 15 on the Papago Reservation between Komelik and Chuichu in Sif Oidak District, and

WHEREAS, The unsurfaced portion of Route No. 15 lies in Pinal County and before Federal funds can be expended for road construction an agreement must be obtained from county authorities to take the road into the county system, and

WHEREAS, Pinal County is willing to take over the road when the construction is completed, and

WHEREAS, Pinal County is desirous of obtaining three sites for sand and gravel which will be used exclusively for maintaining and repairing Route No. 15 on the reservation, the three sites being designated as follows:

1. Site, 5 acres in area, located on west side of road about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles south of Chuichu.
2. Site, 10 acres in area, located about one mile west of road in Cocklebur wash, and about seven miles south of Chuichu.
3. Site, 40 acres in area, located on west side of road, about 1 mile south of Kohatk road and about 14 miles south of Chuichu.

and,

WHEREAS, On April 29 the Sif Oidak District Council passed a Resolution requesting that the Tribal Council give the necessary approval so that the Superintendent of the Papago Agency may grant the right of way, 100 feet wide, to Pinal County for the part of U.S.I.S. Route 15 which lies in Pinal County; that Pinal County be granted three sites to be used for removal of sand and gravel to maintain and repair that part of Route 15 that lies in Pinal County; and that there be no exchange of funds for the right of way grant as the benefits to be derived from the road by the Papago people will more than off-set any monetary consideration.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED BY THE Papago Council that it concur in the above Resolution, authorize the Superintendent to grant the Right of Way, and grant the sites without charge.

The foregoing Resolution was on May 1, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 19 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2 (a) & (c) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe

on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
