

RESOLUTION  
OF THREE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1047

WHEREAS, On April 19, 1959 the San Xavier District Council unanimously approved a request of the U. S. Engineers to make a preliminary survey of the top of Black Mountain, which is on Tribal land of the San Xavier Reservation, and for which the Engineers will pay a fee of \$25.00, and

WHEREAS, The Engineers wish to see if this will be suitable for a control site for launching Nike missiles from a nearby site off the Reservation, and

WHEREAS, This proposed installation is part of a national defense system to protect Tucson and the Davis-Monthan Air base, and

WHEREAS, If the engineers find the site suitable they will then apply for a lease for about 6 acres on top of Black Mountain, as well as a right of way from the control site to the launching, and such lease will first have to be approved by the San Xavier District Council and The Tribal Council.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the U. S. Engineers be granted the right to make the survey and the Superintendent of the Papago Agency be asked to approve and sign the necessary documents to authorize the survey and that the Chairman of the Council be authorized to sign on behalf of the Tribe.

The foregoing Resolution was on May 1, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 19 for and 0 against by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
