

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1051

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribal Council has been considering who to recommend as Chief Judge, and

WHEREAS, After discussion of this question in several Tribal Council meetings and by the Districts in their meetings, the Tribal Council unanimously decided at its June 5 meeting to recommend Richard Hendricks as Chief Judge, and to retain Narcho Ferguson as Associate Judge, and

WHEREAS, Although the Council wishes to pay the salary of the Chief Judge from Tribal funds and Richard Hendricks has agreed to be paid on a basis of \$10.00 per day for each day that Court is in session and he presides over it, it understands that appointment of a Chief Judge must be approved by the Commissioner of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it notify the Bureau of Indian Affairs that it has recommended Richard Hendricks as Chief Judge of the Papago Court and request appointment by the Bureau as soon as possible so that Richard Hendricks may begin to serve as Judge without delay.

The foregoing Resolution was on June 5, 1959, duly enacted by the Papago Council by a vote of 19 for and 0 against, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (b) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 8, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is active as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
