

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1033

WHEREAS, Joann Garcia resigned as Chief Clerk in the Law and Order Department submitting a letter of resignation May 17, 1959, and

WHEREAS, At the time she resigned, in addition to her regular salary, there was also due her 15 hours accrued leave.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that Joann Garcia's resignation be accepted and the Treasurer be instructed to pay the amount due her for salary and accrued leave.

The foregoing Resolution was on July 10, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 18, for and 0 against by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) & (b) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 12, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
