

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1066

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribal Council has been considering the Plan of Operation of the Tribal Herd for more than a year, during which time it has been discussed in Council meetings and at District meetings, and

WHEREAS, A number of changes have been made in the proposed Plan as a result of these discussions, and the wording simplified to make it easier for the Tribal Council and tribal members to understand it, and

WHEREAS, The manager of the Tribal Herd, who has cooperated in the preparation of the Plan of Operation, understands the need for such a Plan and has expressed himself in favor of the proposed Plan, and

WHEREAS, The Plan of Operation is a business plan needed if the Tribal Herd is to be operated successfully, and if the Tribal Herd is operated in a business-like manner it should not only make money for the Tribe as a whole, but will also benefit individual members by providing them better livestock which they can sell at higher prices.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Plan Of Operation of the Tribal Herd per the attached copy be adopted.

The foregoing Resolution was on July 24, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 7 for and 5 against by the Papago Council, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) & (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 924). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
