## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

WIEREAS, The Papago Council passed Resolution 1002 on July 18, 1958, requesting a social and economic survey on the Papago Reservation to help the Tribe and the Bureau of Indian Affairs plan orderly development of the Reservation, and

WHEREAS, This Resolution included a request for an evaluation of the potential mineral resources on the Reservation by qualified mining engineers, and

WHEREAS, The Council also passed Resolution 1026 on December 5, 1958, asking the Bureau to appropriate \$17,000 to be used to have a mining engineer conduct a mining survey to be used to attract mining companies to do intensive exploration and make leases on the Reservation, and thus help provide badly needed income for the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, The Bureau has informed the Tribe it has no funds available either for the social and economic survey or for the mining survey, and therefore it appears it is up to the Tribe to try to do what it can on its own with the meager resources at its disposal, and

WIEREAS, The Tribal Council appropriated \$2500 in the 1960 Fiscal Year badget to be used to hire a consulting engineer on a time and expense basis, and

WHEREAS, Resolution 1026 recommended that K. N. Garard, Route 1, Box 426X, Scottsdale, Arizona, conduct the survey because of his education, professional qualifications, experience, and special knowledge of Indian problems gained during his six years as mining engineer for the Navajo Tribe for whom he is still acting as consultant, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Garard is still available to act as a consultant to the Tribe, and is willing to help the Tribe for at least a year by working at half the rate he regularly receives, and

WHEREAS, The Council believes that hiring a consultant on a time and expense basis with a limitation of \$2500 to be spent during the next Fiscal Year is desirable so it can be determined if interest in mining on the Reservation can be stimulated, and that Mr. Garard is well qualified to do the work

THEREFORE, LET IT HE MESOLVED by the Papago Council that K. N. Garard be employed for the fiscal year 1960 as mining consultant on a time and expense

basis, total payments to him not to exceed \$2500, and that the Chairman of the Papago Tribe be authorized to draw up and approve a contract of employment with Mr. Garard.

The foregoing Resolution was on August 7, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 20 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) & (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
