

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1078

WHEREAS, Louis Jose Mandro, the son of Joseph Foote, deceased, claims that when his father's estate was probated he was not notified, and the estate was settled without his sharing in it, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council feels that the probate of Joseph Foote's estate may not have been in accordance with the Papago Law and Order Code or other applicable regulations, and

WHEREAS, The Council wishes to support Jose Mandro as much as it can if he decides to appeal this matter to the Tribal Court or any other court of jurisdiction.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that in case Jose Mandro decides to appeal against the way his father's estate was probated, the Papago Council will support this appeal, and it also requests that if the case is handled in Tribal Court, the present judge be disqualified to hear the appeal and another judge be appointed to hear the case.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on September 25, 1959, with a vote of 15 for and 0 against during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 2 (1) of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 934).
