RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1060

WHEREAS, The Tribal Council has been considering the recommendation of a Chief Judge for several months, and

WHEREAS, The Council has decided to recommend Cipriano Manuel of Santa Rosa Village as Chief Judge, believing him to be qualified for the position;

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it recommend to the Bureau of Indian Affairs that Cipriano Manuel be appointed Chief Judge of the Papago Tribal Court, to serve 5 days a week, and that his salary for the balance of the 1960 fiscal year be \$100. per week, provided the Bureau of Indian Affairs pays towards the Judge's salary the amount now in the Papago Agency budget for this purpose, which the Council understands is \$2340, and which it has been told will be made available; the balance due to pay the full amount of the judge's salary for the balance of fiscal year 1960 will be paid from funds now budgeted in the Tribal budget for the salary of an Associate Judge, and any additional amount needed for the judge's salary before the year is up will be appropriated by Resolution from Tribal Law and Order Collections or other available Tribal funds, and

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED that the salary of the Chief Judge for fiscal year 1961 be reviewed before June 30, 1960 to determine what salary he will be paid for that period, it being the Council's understanding that the B.I.A. will be able to pay as its share only \$2400 for the entire fiscal year, so the Tribe will have to bear a much larger share of the cost next year if the judge's salary remains the same, and

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council accept the resignation of Marco Ferguson as Associate Judge effective November 1, 1959, and that Cipriano Manuel be appointed Associate Judge beginning October 26, 1959, to serve in this capacity until the B. I. A. takes action on the Council's recommendation that he be appointed Chief Judge, Cipriano Manuel to receive \$10.00 for each day he serves in Tribal Court from October 26, 1959, and that Marco Ferguson shall be retained as a consultant until November 6, 1959, to receive \$10.00 per day for his services, both to be paid from Tribal funds budgeted for the associate judge.

The foregoing Resolution was <sup>en</sup> October 23, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 19 for and 0 against and 2 not voting by the Papago Council at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a), (b), & (f) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
