

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 108A

WHEREAS, At a meeting held Saturday, October 17, 1959, the Chukart Kuk District Council approved a Resolution requesting that the Papago Farms lease be amended as follows:

1. The total acreage under lease to be reduced from 12,288 acres to 7,584 acres; and the acres to be subjugated to be reduced from 10,000 to 5,760 acres, the areas dropped being described as follows:

All of Sections 16, 21, and 29, the South Halves of Sections 19 and 20, all in Township 19 South, Range 1 East. Also the South half and Northwest quarter of Section 22, the South halves of Sections 23 and 24, the North Halves of Sections 9, 10, and 11, and the South .3 Mile of the North Half of Section 12, all in Township 19 South, Range 1 West, G & SRM, Arizona.

Leaving the following areas as the legal description of lands to be retained under lease:

Tract 1 - South Halves of Sections 9, 10, 11 and 12; all of Sections 13, 14, 15 and 16, Northeast Quarter of Section 22, North Halves of Sections 23 and 24; Township 19 South, Range 1 West, G&SRM, Arizona.

Tract 2 - South .8 Mile of Sections 7 and 8; all of Sections 17 and 18; North Halves of 19 and 20, Township 19 South, Range 1 East, G&SRM, Arizona.

2. The schedule of land to be subjugated to be amended to the following:

3. The schedule for drilling wells each year to amended to the following:

4. The rental schedule be amended as follows:

- a. \$12,000 due for second year, to be paid December 27, 1959
- b. Rental due for 3rd and 4th years to be a minimum of \$10,000 per year, but if rental from acreage under subjugation should exceed this amount at the the rental rates stipulated in the lease, the larger amount will be paid.
- c. After the 4th year the minimum rental due will be in accordance with the subjugation schedule and will be at least

LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT IN ADDITION TO THE REQUESTED AMENDMENTS, THAT THE COUNCILS authorize Papago Farms to continue to maintain the dike located on the North and East sides of the Farms on Papago Tribal land; that no requests for exchange of land will be considered at this time because the District wants Papago Farms to concentrate its efforts in the reduced leased area; and that Papago Farms request to make a study of surface water flow be postponed for consideration until some future date.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to make the above amendments to the Papago Farms lease.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on October 23, 1959, with a vote of 17 for and 0 against during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section (H) of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
