

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1044

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 1044 passed May 1, 1959, by the Papago Council provides for the granting of right of way, 100 feet wide, and three sand and gravel sites, to Pinal County for that part of U.S.I.S. Route No. 15 which lies in Pinal County, and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 507 dated November 3, 1950, grants a right of way to Pima County for San Miguel Road No. 671 and Kamolik Road No. 672 which lie in Pima County, and

WHEREAS, It now appears more feasible for the State of Arizona to take over the maintenance of the road, when construction is completed, for that part of Route No. 15 in Pinal County and Kamolik Road No. 672 in Pima County, and

WHEREAS, In matters of this type where the Bureau of Indian Affairs constructs the road and turns it over to a non-Federal agency, it is incumbent upon the Bureau of Indian Affairs to prepare the maps of alignment and make the application for the rights of way;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the "Resolved" parts of Resolutions Nos. 507 and 1044 be amended insofar as they pertain to U.S.I.S. No. 15 in Pinal County, and Kamolik Road No. 672 from State Highway 66 near Covered Wells to Gu Kamolik village, and rights of way therefore granted to the United States of America, its successors and assigns, with the right to construct, maintain, and repair improvements thereon, and with the further right to the United States of America, its successors and assigns, to transfer the said rights of way by alignment, grant, or otherwise.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on November 6, 1959, with a vote of 17 for and 1 not voting, 0 against during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 3 (h) of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 16, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the Reclassification by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
