RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1039

WHEREAS, The Papago Tribal Council passed Resolution 1081 on October 23, 1959, amending Resolution 1037 of March 20, 1959, to accept the wording proposed by the Secretary of the Interior for the constitutional amendment on mining, and

WHEREAS, In his letter of August 25, 1959, to the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, the Secretary said that if this wording were accepted by the Council and Resolution 1037 amended to that effect, then his previous election order would be modified and an election authorized. The Secretary also suggested that tribal officials be consulted to arrange a mutually convenient time for the election, and

WHEREAS, The Council believes Saturday, April 9, 1960, would be the best time to hold the election.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the date of Saturday, April 9, 1960 be set for the election on the proposed constitutional amendment on mining, which shall be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations governing such elections under the Indian Reorganization Act, as amended (48 Stat. 984, 49 Stat. 378).

The foregoing Resolution was on December 4, 1959, duly enacted by a vote of 17 for, 0 against, by the Papago Council at a meeting at which a quorum was present pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Article V, Sections 4, 5, & Article IX--Amendments of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 13, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
