

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1091

WHEREAS, On December 13, 1959, the Schuk Toak District Council approved an application of the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads for approximately 200,000 tons of sand and gravel to be used on the new Kitt Peak highway, in accordance with the Bureau's letter of application of October 29, 1959, accompanied by a plat of the sites requested, which was originally submitted to the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and

WHEREAS, The Schuk Toak District Council approved this Resolution subject to following conditions:

1. The agreed price is 5 cents per ton, one-half of proceeds to go to Schuk Toak District and one-half to the Papago Tribal Council.
2. The Bureau of Public Roads will set up an accurate method to determine the exact amount of material removed, and payment will be made at regular intervals.
3. Proper precautions will be taken to protect against any injury to livestock or people, and if such injury does occur, the people will be entitled to receive compensation for injury to them or their animals.
4. The access road from the new road to the wash south of Pan Talk Villages will be made as far south of the village as possible so it will not interfere with any village activities.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it approve the Resolution of the Schuk Toak District Council accepting the application of the Bureau of Public Roads for a sand and gravel permit, and that it request the Papago Agency to issue the necessary permit to the Bureau of Public Roads in accordance with its regular procedure.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on January 8, 1960, with a vote of 20 for and 0 against during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 3 (h) of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 964). The Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
