RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1098

WHEREAS, The United States Army Electronic Proving Ground at Ft. Huachuca has requested pensission to make a preliminary survey of nine possible drone control sites on the Papago Reservation, the approximate locations outlined within red circles on a Reservation map accompanying their application of January 27, 1960, the location of these areas having been shown to the Council at its March 4, 1960, meeting, and

WHEREAS, THIS is similar to a previous survey requested by the U.S.A.E.P.G. which was unanimously approved by the Tribal Council on March 6, 1959, and for which a formal agreement was entered into April 15, 1959; except that the sites on the present application are different, and the U.S.A.E.P.G. plans to make the survey by using a helicopter, and will use ground parties only when helicopter investigation is impossible; otherwise conditions governing entry will be the same as on the previsor agreement, and

WHENEAS, The Council understands such permission is given for the inspection of sites only and does not give the U.S.A.E.P.G. any rights to leases; and if the U.S.A.E.P.G. applies for leases on any of the sites, it will first have to secure the approval of the District Council in which the site is located, and then of the Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, The Council understands that a fee of \$200 will be paid for this permit.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that the application of the U.S.A.E.P.C. for permission to make the desired survey be approved as outlined above, and that it authroize the Chairman to sign the permit.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago on March 4, 1960, with a vote of 21 for and 3 against during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, 48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior; pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
