

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, At the December 2, 1960 meeting, the Papago Tribal Council unanimously passed a Resolution adopting the children of Burton Narcho as members of the Papago Tribe, but through an oversight the Resolution was not written up and presented to the Papago Agency, and

WHEREAS, The facts are that Burton Narcho is on the official tribal roll as a full-blooded member of the Papago Tribe, and his wife Josephine is one-half Papago and one-half Navajo, which makes the children 3/4 Papago, and

WHEREAS, The children have not been enrolled and are not members because they were not born on the Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, The Council can adopt the children as members of the tribe under provisions of Article II, Section 1 (b).

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it admit the children of Burton Narcho and his wife Josephine, whose names are:

Karen Narcho  
Malcolm Narcho  
Towns Narcho  
Cileen Narcho

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on February 3, 1961, with a vote of 21 for, and 0 against, 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 1 (b) of Article II of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the act of June 18, 1934 (Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
