

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RESOLUTION NO. 1157

Whereas, At the time it recommended approval of the application of Hunting Geophysical Services, Inc., for a reservation-wide prospecting permit with option to lease, the Council withdrew two areas from the proposed application, one of which is the area east of Santa Rosa Wash in the following townships:

T. 83, R. 5E; T. 83, R. 4E; T. 9S, R. 4E; T. 9S, R. 5E;  
T. 10S, R. 5E; T. 10S, R. 4E; , and

Whereas, The reason the area was withdrawn is because there has been recent active interest by mining companies in this particular area and therefore the Council did not feel it should be included in the application made by Hunting Geophysical Services, Inc., and

Whereas, The Utah Development Company has recently made an application for a prospecting permit with option to lease in part of the area that has been withdrawn, Phelps-Dodge Corporation has also expressed active interest in part of the area, and Trans-Arizona Resources, Inc., who operate the Lake Shore Mine, have indicated they want an opportunity to be considered if leasing is being proposed, and

Whereas, The Tribal Council has expressed itself that it hopes the present application of Hunting Geophysical Services can be negotiated on that part of the Reservation not withdrawn by the Council, but it believes that in view of the interest being shown, it would be desirable to ask that advertisement be made for bids in the withdrawn area.

Therefore, Let it be Resolved by the Papago Tribal Council that the Bureau of Indian Affairs be requested to advertise an area or areas within the boundaries described above, for an exclusive prospecting permit with option to lease, which it thinks will be best suited to secure bids which it thinks will be most favorable to the Tribe.

*Prospecting Permit*

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on March 3, 1951, with a vote of 18 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority in the Council by Article V, Section 3 (C), of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 15, 1934 (Stat. 984) Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
