

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS, At a meeting held March 21, 1961, the Hickman District Council considered an application from El Paso Natural Gas Company to install a cathodic protection station on their Apo natural gas pipe line in Section 1, T. 100, R. 28, Papago Reservation, and

WHEREAS, although El Paso Natural Gas offered \$200 for the station site to cover the period up the date of expiration of the lease on the main pipe-line in 1977, The Hickman District Council feels the amount offered is not enough for the length of time involved, but will approve the application if El Paso Natural Gas pays \$600 for the site, the amount to be divided one-half to the Hickman District and one-half to the Papago Tribe.

WHEREAS, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it approve the application of El Paso Natural Gas Company provided it pay \$600.00, and that if El Paso Natural Gas Company agrees to this amount, that the Papago Agency be asked to insure the necessary permit, subject to government regulations.

The foregoing Resolution was on April 7, 1961, duly enacted by a vote of 17 for and 3 against by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 4, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 954). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the resolution by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
