

RESOLUTION  
OF THE  
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1150

WHEREAS, On March 10, 1961, the Gila District Council considered the application of Phelps-Dodge to renew their silica permit in the area near the Sierra Blanca mountains, and

WHEREAS, Phelps-Dodge Corporation will continue to pay 20 cents per ton for the silica removed on the on the 2.07 acres of land involved and will also continue to pay a minimum advance royalty of \$100.00 per year.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that it approve the application of Phelps-Dodge Corporation for renewal of its previous silica permit for a period of 2 years and that the Papago Agency be asked to prepare the renewal in accordance with government regulations.

The foregoing Resolution was on April 7, 1961, duly enacted by a vote of 20 for and 0 against by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on November 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 10, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to the reconsideration by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
