

RESOLUTION
OF THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. No. 116

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 1127 passed September 2, 1960, by the Papago Council, gives consent to the granting of a right of way to Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph Company for the present telephone lines existing on the Papago Indian Reservation, but failed to include service lines as part of the Right of way grant, and

WHEREAS, the Papago Council desires to encourage the use of telephones and to facilitate the extension of service lines for such phones to Indian homes, churches, and schools, especially in sparsely settled areas where phones may be located some distance from the main distribution line.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED BY The Papago Council that telephones rights of way for service lines be granted by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency; that the grantees submit plat drawings showing locations, size, and extent of the lines in accordance with Federal regulations; and that the grantees pay to the Papago Tribe the amount of \$1.00 per pole needed for any service lines on such rights of way; and

LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall apply only to service lines, and that a right of way for any distribution line shall not be granted until an application has been made to the Papago council and approval received from the Council.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on May 5, 1961, with a vote of 13 for, and 6 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the act of June 18, 1934 (Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and by-laws of the Papago Tribe.
