RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. No. 1166

WHEREAS, Ramon Garcia has permitted a tent to be erected on tribal land near his store at Sells, and the Council understands that religious services are being held in it which are being conducted by non-indians, and

WHEREAS, It is regular district procedure that anyone, whether a member of the tribe or not, must secure approval of the District Council to occupy any tribal land in the District and put up temporary or permanent structures on it, and

WHEREAS, No application was made to the District Council for permission in this case by either Ramon Garcia or the non-indians involved, which is in violation of the procedures of the District Councils, and the Papago Constitution.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that Ramon Garcia be ordered to take down the tent, and that the non-indians involved be ordered to leave the Reservation, and

LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED that if they wish to make a regular application, it will be considered by the District and the Tribal Council.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on May 5, 1961, with a vote of 19 for, and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the act of June 18, 1934 (Stat.984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
