WHEREAS, The Council believes the budget has been carefully prepared and represents a reasonably accurate estimate of expenses it considers essential to the proper operation of Tribal Government, and believes the Income has been conservatively estimated, and

WHEREAS, Although the budget estimates for the past 2 fiscal years have provided for a large deficit, actually Income has substantially exceeded expenses both years, and the financial position of the Tribe has been improving slowly. Therefore, the Council approves the deficit estimated at \$ 18,800 for the 1962 fiscal year, with the understanding that if Income is not as much as expected, an effort will be made to reduce or eliminate authorized budget expenditures whenever possible, but the Council hopes that Income continues to exceed expenses as in the past two years.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED By the Papago Tribal Council that the Treasurer be authorized to sign purchase orders and vouchers in the amounts provided in the above budget against the properly designated accounts, and

LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED that inasmuch as approximatley \$ 14,000 of the anticipated income will be sent to the Treasury and will have to be released to the Tribe by the Treasury, and inasmuch as expenses may exceed income by \$18,800, that the Council request the Superintendent to withdraw the sum of up to \$25,000 of available Tribal funds in the Treasury, as needed, to be placed in the Agency IIM account of the Tribal Council, PT-1A, in order to maintain a satisfactory working balance.

The foregoing Resolution was approved on June 2, 1961 duly enacted by a vote of 21 for and O against, by the Papago Council during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on Jenuary 6, 1937; pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984.

Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and by-laws of the Papago Tribe.
