RÉS No. 1176

WHEREAS, The domestic water supplies needed for the village on the Gila Bend Reservation will have to be continued to be hauled for some months to come because it appears that the relocation of the village and drilling of a new well for domestic water will not take place for some time, and

EMERIAS, It is estimated that water may have to be hauled to the village 5 days a week during all of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1961, and

WHEREAS, At a meeting at Gila Bend District, the District Council approved a budget for this purpose and 27 residents of the village also signed a restition urging that budget be set up, but the District Council sent a message by the Tribal Council representatives asking the Tribal Office to figure out the estimated cost of hauling water for the year, and also asking that \$100 be included in the budget for windmill repair or purchase, of gasoline for the well now being used to supply other needs but which is not suitable for drinking purposes, and

WHEREAS, The Tribal Office estimates the cost of hauling water for 5 days a week to be \$8.00 per day, or \$2080 for the year, and this figure has been approved by the Gila Bend representatives to the Tribal Council.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT the Gila Bend District budget for the 1962 fiscal year be as follows:

Provision for hauling water 5 days per week at \$8.00 per day for 52 weeks

\$ 2080.00

Windmill repairs, or gas for operation of engine on pump

100.00

\$ 2180.00

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on June 2, 1961, with a vote of 21 for and 0 against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (a) Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the act of June 18, 1934 (Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
