

## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 1199

WHEREAS, It has been determined by Bureau Officials and thoroughly discussed with them that the following buildings and improvements including personal property contained therein and are situated on Indian Land or Administrative Reserve and are no longer required by the Bureau of Indian Affairs:

- Baboquivari Ranger Station Building No. 501 Frame W/cement stucco. 454-482 Coal Range
- 2. Chuichu Day School Building No. 222 - Concrete Block 454-710 Gas Range, 454-709 Refrigerator, 454-1391 Air Cooler, 454-1346, 1345, 1347, 1351, 1434 Gas Heaters. 75 lb. Co 2 Fire Extinguisher.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED By the Papago Council that the Bureau convey the above mentioned buildings and improvements including personal property contained therein to the Tribe for the administration of its affairs; with the understanding that electrical power be furnished by the San Carlos irrigation project and paid for by the Tribe, also Bureau gas will be disconnected. \$5.00 per month water charge will be paid by the Tribe pending decision by the Tribal Council as to how the building will be used; including sewer charge of \$2.00 per month.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on September 1, 1961 with a vote of 22 for and 0 \_\_against, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a), Article V, of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (Stat. 984).
