RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

ÉS. NO. 1190

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Papago Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs no longer has funds available for expenditure on the maintenance of stock wells throughout the Papago Reservation and;

WHEREAS, the Superintendent has assured the Papago Tribe that technical assistance will be available as time from other duties permits and;

WHEREAS, materials and equipment on hand which are applicable to the maintenance of stock water facilities will be made available to the Papago people and,

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the people that certain appurtenances on the wells should be traded in on new equipment as they become worn, which necessitates the ownership of said equipment resting with the Papago Tribe.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the ownership of the stock water facilities on the Papago Reservation be assumed by the Papago Tribe with the districts having the responsibility for maintaining the wells within their respective district:

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on September 1, 1961, with a vote of 16 for and 5 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (k), Article V, of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
